I have now been in the chair for eight months and I am pleased to say that your **committee** has worked hard to deliver a varied and exciting programme for U3A both in Townsville and Magnetic Island. On the surface you don't always see what is being done on your behalf and for you benefit but I can assure you that the committee is always seeking ways of improving things.

The **strategic planning** group (Peter Hurst, Maureen Wright, Donna Kippax, Linsey Plante and I) have produced a draft Strategic Plan. After the committee's input we will seek a wider endorsement of the plan from the membership. Our **Friday talks** are becoming more popular. The eclectic program seems to be part of the appeal. **Our profile** in the community has been lifted through our new flyers plus our promotional stands at events and a shopping centre, as well as the efforts of members in spreading the word.

COMPLIANCE WITH LEGISLATION

Leisa Donlan, an expert on the legislation governing not-for-profit organisations, conducted a workshop for U3A Network Queensland in Townsville recently for North Queensland. Atherton/Tablelands, Cairns, Mackay and of course Townsville were represented.

Here is a report on the workshop by Alan Williams:

The workshop was on 'Good Governance' which entailed examining our constitution (Rules of Incorporation) versus the latest legal changes, basic systems including membership, finance, ethics, insurance and committee responsibilities.

U3A Townsville strives to keep membership cost affordable and relies on donations and grants to make up a shortfall between our membership income and expenses.

We obtain grants from various organisations such as the Townsville City Council. The committee is looking for some assistance in this area.We are seeking three or four members who will manage this revenue raising. The **Grants and Sponsorship Sub-Committee** will:

Identify potential sources of funds

Without getting into specifics, there were areas in all the topics covered that we all considered that we fell far short of perfection. So at the end of the day we acknowledged that there were things on our plate that need our continued attention.

Rest assured, your committee is hard at work to ensure gold star performance, and making your U3A an organisation in which you can be proud to be a member.

We will be required to update some of our current practices to be compliant with the act and the committee will address these issues over the coming months.

CYBERSECURITY AND MY NORTON PRODUCT

Where our money comes from

I was recently caught up in a scam that came with my Norton Anti Virus renewal. Please be aware. I purchased a 1 year's subscription of Norton, which now comes with a code. When I tried to enter the code into my computer the code would not work. This started off a chain of events that were a nightmare. I was taken to a 'Norton' site to a 'talk' session where the person on the line passed me over to 'Norton computer section'. They in turn told me that I had been hacked by a virus named Raddl33. and that I needed it to be taken care of by them, as a local computer person would not be able to do it.

They needed to enter my computer to do the 'fix' and take off the hacker. I allowed them to do this, and was on my mobile with them for over an hour. I was told they needed payment to be able to go ahead, and stupid me, paid them with an internet transfer of \$376 which was paid to 'Norton Global in Melbourne'. (I could have been suckered in for a 10 year fix for \$900!!) After further emailing when they attempted to get my bank info I asked a local person to have a look: they found the fake Norton had put a programme onto my computer that allowed them to enter it. In brief, another \$100 to have that fixed. Then all the changing over of bank passwords, numbers etc. Beware!
